Global Strategic Framework (SSG-GSF)



The SSF-GSF is a partnership mechanism for stakeholders to collaborate at a global level.




Monitoring, evaluation and learning (MEL) framework

The MEL framework promotes SSF Guidelines implementation through monitoring.




Collaboration is key to SSF Guidelines implementation
