1. WHAT IS WORLD TRADE ORGANISATION(WTO)?

- GLOBAL ORGANISATION MADE UP OF 164 MEMBER COUNTRIES AND DEALS WITH RULES OF TRADE BETWEEN COUNTRIES
- WTO BORN IN 1995 FROM MOTHER'S NAME GATT (WHO WAS BORN IN 1947)
- ▶ GATT IS SISTER OF IMF AND WORLD BANK
- ▶ JOB OF WTO IF THERE ARE DISPUTES BETWEEN NATIONS ABOUT TRADE, THEN WTO IS CALLED TO RESOLVE IT

2. WHAT IS SUBSIDY?

- SUBSIDY A TEMPORARY GIFT
- SUBSIDY FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTION GIVEN TO HELP OR TO ENCOURAGE SOMETHING GOOD OR DESIRABLE TO HAPPEN
- SUBSIDY USUALLY GIVEN BY GOVERNMENT

FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTION FROM GOVERNMENT



- GIVEN BY GOVERNMENT
- POLITICALLY DIFFICULT TO WITHDRAW
- INTENDED TO SUPPORT LIVELIHOOD OF FISHERS

THIS IS ALSO A SUBSIDY!



- GIVEN BY COMPANY
- CAN BE WITHDRAWN EASILY
- INTENDED TO INCREASE PROFIT OF COMPANY

3. HISTORY OF FISHERIES SUBSIDIES

- a. Debate of Fisheries subsidies PRE-DATES the WTO
- b. Fisheries and fishers of developed, industrialised countries where HUGELY subsidized right from the 19th century
- c. So talk about curbing fisheries subsidies today is hugely HYPOCRITICAL

Frederick List, German Economist of the 19th Century once said:

It is a very common and clever devise that when anyone has attained the summit of greatness, he kicks aways the ladder by which he had climbed up, in order to deprive others of the means of climbing up after him



d. Finally, the fisheries subsidies debates have been used by countries as a bargaining chip to get other deals and benefits



4. IMPLICATIONS OF WTO -AFS

a. The WTOA on FS, even in its current form, (i.e., without the overcapacity and overfishing pillar) should/will force the Union of India to seriously consider management of the whole EEZ

b. The implications of the WTO-AFS will also have a bearing on the way the regulation and management of fisheries are currently divided between the maritime states of India and the Union Government.

c. The WTO-AFS should NOT result in the stoppage of subsidies.

INCREASE subsidies. But CHANGE THE PURPOSE for which they are being given.

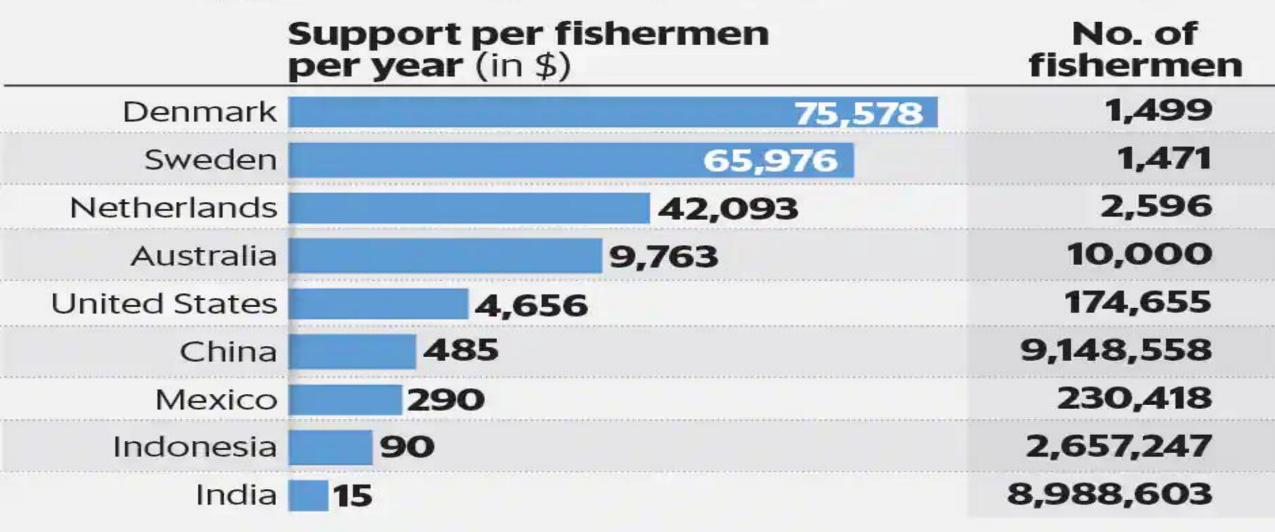
